Huron Pointe shooters earn national honors

On August 7 and 8, over 1,000 shooters from across the country, ages nine to 23, took part in the American Trap Association (ATA) Grand American AIM (Achievement - Integrity - Marksmanship) Nationals held at the World Shooting & Recreational Complex in Sparta, Illinois. A five-member Graduate team from Huron Pointe Sportsman's Association Youth Shotgun Program, which took first place in the Michigan State AIM shoot, continued their winning streak by placing second in the National Tournament, earning silver medals.

The Graduate team included Clarence VanCamp of Marysville, Mike Sintebin of New Baltimore, Ben Wallace of St. Clair Shores, Steve Hawley of Macomb Township and John Adams of Durand. Clarence VanCamp also earned an individual silver medal after taking part in a tie breaker by shooting 25 birds straight, and Mike Sintebin won first place in Graduate Class C. Steve Hawley's name was drawn to receive a \$1,000 ATA scholarship to use at the college of his choice.
